

## MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Renee Lormé-Gulbrandsen

Oak Bay Volunteer Services Society celebrated its 45th year of service this year. What an impactful legacy our organization already has in the community of Oak Bay, particularly after two years of the COVID-19 pandemic. This legacy is a testament to the staff, board of directors, and volunteers who have dedicated many hours of service and an unwavering commitment to serve.

In 2022-2023, OBVS transitioned from our COVID-19 Health Emergency Response to our Communicable Disease Operations. This transition signalled a switch from preventative policies and procedures to operating with the understanding that the COVID-19 virus will be a variable for ongoing service and program provision into the future. It also signalled the

need to provide a hybrid array of services, continuing with those introduced during the height of the pandemic with a return to others offered before the pandemic. We also reinstated our Hop Aboard Seniors Shopping Bus program to the delight of many clients.

The move to a hybrid array of services dramatically increased requests as our 532 clients utilized the new offerings. Our 186 volunteers delivered nearly 5,700 services, an increase of 1,200 from the previous year. This increase reflects the trust and reliability felt by clients for our volunteers who extended kindness during a continued time of uneasiness, particularly for individuals with health vulnerabilities.

Our 45th Anniversary Celebration on June 14, 2022, was our first in-person event since 2019. While we hosted our annual general meeting, we also honoured deserving volunteers who reached milestones in volunteering with OBVS, including 25, 30, 35, and 40 years of service! There was excitement in the air as staff, volunteers, and guests reconnected for the first time in years.

Any executive director knows success relies on a collaborative team who shares your vision. Thanks to Ruth, Jaimie, Melinda, and Robin's dedication and expertise, OBVS has successfully navigated our transition to our 'new normal' this year. Their commitment to excellence in volunteer coordination, client support and outreach, and administration is

greatly treasured and appreciated.

This year we honour volunteer Eric Payne who has dedicated 20 years of service to Oak Bay Volunteers. He is among 17 volunteers being recognized for milestones this year (see page 14) . We thank each of them for their steadfast dedication to serving the community.

Serving Oak Bay Volunteer Services as Executive Director for a fifth year has been a pleasure, and I look forward to an exciting year ahead for our organization.

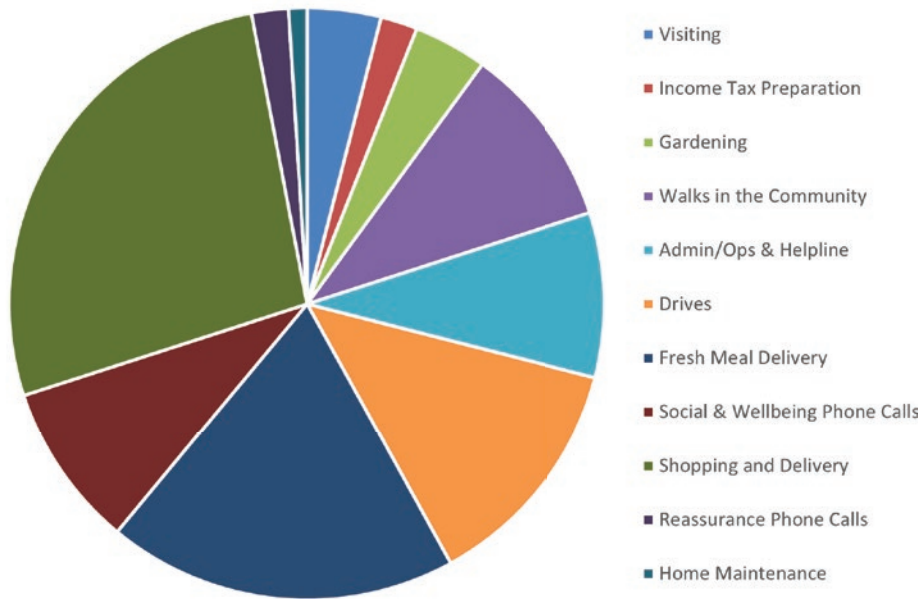

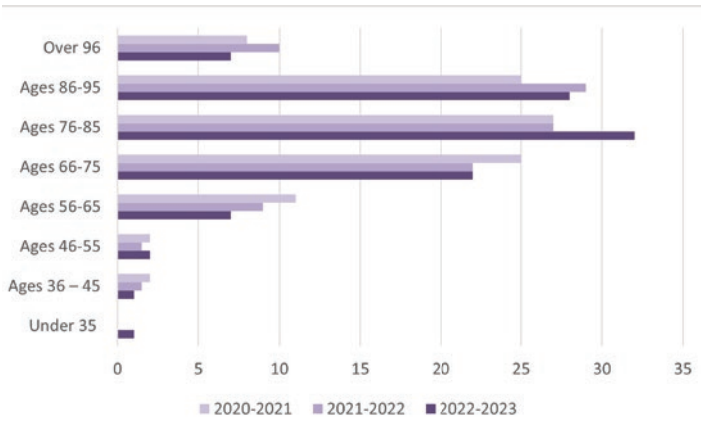

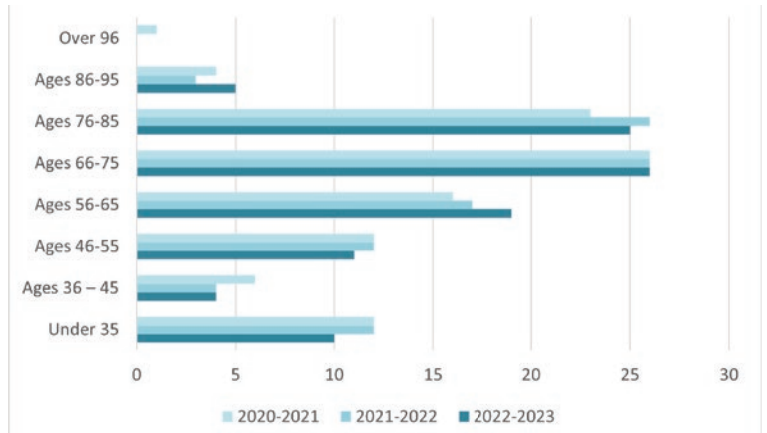
### VOLUNTEER ACTIVITIES AND CLIENT SERVICES

Prior to the pandemic, the Oak Bay Volunteer Services Society was a well-utilized resource for the Oak Bay community, delivering groceries, pharmaceuticals, and rides to necessary appointments. When the pandemic hit, the society became an essential link between those isolated at home and the rest of the world, delivering over 10,200 hours of service to a community with complex needs: primarily seniors and folks with physical and mental health challenges who were locked down and reliant on the kindness of volunteers to bring them groceries, medications, and personal contact.

"In Oak Bay, there's always been this sense of generosity," said Renee Lormé-Gulbrandsen, Executive Director of the Oak Bay Volunteer Services Society. "We've been fortunate with our efforts to recruit volunteers because people really love this community. Between April 2021 and March 2022, we had 188 volunteers assisting 511 clients. This is our 45<sup>th</sup> year of service to the community, and through the generosity of organizations like the Victoria Foundation and the kindness and dedication of our volunteers, we're able to ensure people get the support they need, especially during the most challenging times."
